<b>Family Trainings/ Activities</b>	D. Crockett Elementary School will provide families with the opportunity to participate in training sessions focused on volunteering, understanding school programs, and academic expectations. These sessions will help parents and guardians gain valuable insights into supporting their child's daily academic growth and success. This information will be communicated through ParentSquare, our weekly newsletter, and the school website to ensure all families are informed and able to engage in these valuable learning opportunities.

<b>Curriculum</b>	D. Crockett Elementary School utilizes a high-quality curriculum designed to support student growth and achievement. Information about our curriculum, along with other forms of assessment used to measure student growth and proficiency levels, will be shared with families through various channels. School staff will communicate these details via flyers, parent-teacher conferences, meetings, and newsletters to ensure that parents and guardians are well-informed and actively involved in understanding their child's academic progress.			
<b>Forms of Academic Assessments</b>	At D. Crockett Elementary, we use common formative assessments that are administered by every teacher to ensure consistency and accuracy in measuring student progress. Regardless of the teacher, each student is assessed using the same assessments provided by the TEKS Resource System. These assessments are designed to closely align with the State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness (STAAR) test, ensuring that students are well-prepared for state-level evaluations and their academic growth is consistently monitored.			
	Previous STAAR tests & NWEA map scores will be released and utilized for assessment and instruction in addition to other curriculums.			
	Test information, including TELPAS, NWEA map scores and STAAR will be shared with parents when available by school/state.

	Crockett Elementary tracks each child's growth throughout the year using local assessments (mentioned above). Each child has an AVID folder where teachers help them track their own learning growth.
