Forms of Academic Assessments	At Highlands Elementary, all teachers utilize common formative assessments to ensure consistency and accuracy in tracking student progress. Every student, regardless of their teacher, takes the same assessments from the TEKS Resource System. These assessments are closely aligned with the State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness (STAAR), ensuring that students are well-prepared for state evaluations and their academic growth is consistently monitored.					
	Previous STAAR tests will be released and utilized for assessment and instruction in addition to the Bluebonnet Learning curriculum.
