AP students will have the opportunity to take all AP Exams at home (online). AP Exams are scheduled from May 11-May 22 and will be 45 minutes in length. This year's tests will cover the content and skills learned through early March. Students can join free AP online classes and review sessions to prepare for the exams.

About the AP Exams

- AP Exams will be Free Response and about 45 minutes each, with additional 5 minutes to upload.
- Students may use notes, textbooks and internet search, but **NO** communication with other students or teachers.
- AP LOTE and Music Theory classes must upload oral components.
- AP Exams are scheduled for May 11-22. Make sure you plan to test in May window.
- Make-up testing is June 1-5. Make-up dates will only be available for emergencies and need administrator approval.
- The exams will focus on content most teachers covered prior to March. So, this year's exams have been designed to honor and reward the work students did prior to widespread school closures.
- Students must login 30 minutes before test time to answer security questions and make sure everything is working correctly.
- Colleges across the country are voicing strong support for students to complete the AP experience, take the exam, and receive the college credit they deserve.

Preparing for AP Exams

- Students who are using a school email (@student.gccisd.net) **NEED** to CHANGE the email to a personal email, so they receive information regarding their exams. This is very IMPORTANT! or students will not receive their exam information. See instructions below:

AP Testing Security & Consequences

Students may use notes, textbooks and internet search, but **NO** communication with others. At a minimum, test takers should understand that those attempting to gain an unfair advantage will either be blocked from testing or their AP scores will be canceled. Their high school will be notified, as well as any college or other organization to which the student has planned or has already send any College Board scores (including SAT® scores). They can also be prohibited from taking a future Advanced Placement® Exam as well as the SAT, SAT Subject Tests™, or CLEP® assessments.

3. Click Account Settings
4. Scroll down to Email Address
5. If you are using a school email (@student.gccisd.net) you must change it to a personal email address.

Once a student changes their email address, they will begin to get email from the College board regarding exams for 2019-2020. IMPORTANT: ANY STUDENT USING A SCHOOL ISSUED EMAIL ADDRESS IS TAKING A CHANCE AND MAY NOT BE ABLE TO ACCESS AP TESTING IN MAY.
